NCAABCB President Nancy Gooch's Remarks

In last week's e-newsletter, NCAABCB reported that President Nancy Gooch addressed the NC House ABC Committee at its 2-hour oversight hearing of the liquor shortage issue affecting the state. Below are President Gooch's comments she delivered.

Chairman Moffitt and Members of the House ABC Committee:

My name is Nancy Gooch and I serve as the President of the North Carolina Association of ABC Boards. Over the past 22 years I have worked as a store clerk, assistant manager, and I'm currently the general manager in Siler City. I appreciate the committee's continued commitment to ensuring that our State's ABC system works well for our customers and the communities that we serve.

Over the past two years our boards have worked through a variety of challenges from many sources unlike any that I've experienced in the past 22 years, including:

- Covid-19 Pandemic and the required operational changes to keep both our customers and staff safe.
- National supply chain issues that have impacted our industry nationally and at times, has limited the availability of products.
- The implementation of long-awaited upgrades to our system that will allow for more efficient ordering and delivery processes to the local boards.

During that same time period, we've experienced record breaking growth. In 2020 alone our sales increased by almost 20% (19.74%). We sold an additional 10.5 million bottles over 2019. Since 2017 our sales have increased by 35%. While the growth allows for increased revenues to the General Fund as well as to local communities, as you might imagine, it also adds demand to our system.

We've worked with our members to ensure that we have open lines of communication with our customers, the ABC Commission and LB&B as we continue to work through the challenges of change and growth.

We are optimistic that there are changes included in the contract will help us become more efficient and we look forward to the full implementation of these changes.

We are committed to working with you as well as the ABC Commission and LB&B as we continue to rise to challenges of the day and address the needs of the future.
